
Experience Works! Program Works for Julian!

Program, funded by the Westmoreland-Fayette Workforce Investment Board, allows for youth to gain valuable work experience to help prepare them to become productive members of society. Through the program he worked at the Monessen Library for 240 hours. He enjoyed working there so much that in 2020 he returned back to the Experience Works! Program as a WIOA eligible participant and worked at the Monessen Library again! After he successfully completed the 240 hours as a WIOA participant, it sparked his interest to pursue a career in Human Services/Community Services.

Shortly after, he was able to obtain his Driver's License through the Education and Technology Institute Drivers School through a scholarship from Mike Kelly Toyota and really begin to start making a difference in his community. He applied for a job at the Monessen Civic Center. He was hired on as the Director of Recreational Activities for the City of Monessen.

Julian is now paying it forward by having the Monessen Civic Center become an Experience Works! Program worksite for the Private Industry Council. He plans to have his youth participate in preparing for the Juneteenth Celebration in the community. They will also help prepare and

participate in the Positive Action for Summer Program. The workers will be mentors to the middle school age kids and will help clean and maintain the Monessen Civic Center. Julian has a full schedule planned for his youth workers through the Civic Center. Private Industry Council is excited to watch Julian continue to flourish as he pours himself back into the community. Julian takes his responsibilities with this community very seriously.
